# P.E and Sport Premium Funding 2023 – 2024

The funding aims to:

• Support schools in making additional and sustainable improvements to the quality of the P.E and sport on offer



Total funding received/ to be received:

November 2023 – £11,684 May 2024 - £8,346 Total allocation for 2023-2024 - £20.030

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- PE is taught by a specialist PE teacher since January 2022.
- Jumping pillows have been installed in July 2022 for Early Years and KS2.
- Dinner time clubs run daily for children in KS2.
- The variety of sport offered to pupils across the school has been enhanced (PE lessons, dinner time clubs and after school clubs).
- Stronger links have been established with other schools Selected KS2 pupils are engaging competitively in sports by representing their school more frequently e.g. friendly matches with other schools, City Swimming Gala and Northwood Stadium.
- Gifted and Talented/Lower ability swimmers are targeted and offered extra swimming lessons.
- SEN/EHC children engage in weekly intervention sessions with our specialist PE teacher.
- In summer 2023, our Y6 children started to engage in sports leader roles.

### Areas for further improvement and baseline evidence of need:

- PE lead/PE Teacher to engage in further CPD opportunities.
- To seek new opportunities to engage in competitive sports.
- To continue to target SEN/EHC pupils who are struggling to meet National Curriculum objectives (interventions) and those who are deemed less active in lessons.
- To further promote pupils' leadership skills when leading sport during dinner times (Year 6 Sports Leaders) which will help to ensure children are physically active during break and dinner times.

#### **Evaluation – To be completed July 2024**

#### Key indicator 1: Increase all staff's confidence, knowledge and skills in teaching PE and sport

CPD opportunities provided to staff to improve the quality of teaching in PE and support given to PE teacher to manage conflicts whole school, for example, new behaviour strategy has been implemented on school grounds where PE is taught. Implementing this strategy has helped to promote the learning within lessons and during club times allowing staff to feel more confident when teaching and managing behaviour.



#### Key indicator 2: Increasing engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity and sport

Children are consistently more active for sustained periods of times regularly throughout the day. Port Vale have run clubs with Y1, Y2, Y3 and Y4 from September to April (16 pupils). 16 Y6 are taking part in a football after school football club from April to July. Children are engaging well with sports club and these clubs have high attendance.

#### Key indicator 3: Raising the profile of PE and sport across the school, to support whole school improvement

8 Year 6 playground leaders are helping to raise the profile of PE and sport across the Academy. Port Vale came to the opening of our new all-weather pitch on Thursday 9<sup>th</sup> November 2023. Year 6 playground leaders have been leading several activities on the KS1 playground to help them develop and learn leadership skills. Because of their active role, KS1 children are engaging in more competitive activities during lunch times. 6 of these leaders will be attending a leadership presentation on Wednesday 26<sup>th</sup> June at Stoke City Football Stadium.

### Key indicator 4: Offer a broader and more equal experience of a range of sports and physical activities to all pupils


Baseline 48 children were working towards age related expectation in PE. In April 21 children are now working towards which means 27 pupils across the

Academy are now working at the expected level. SEN clubs have helped to support progress across the Academy as Mr Turner has been focusing on fundamental skills based on assessment within lessons.


Swimming Data – 89.5% of Year 6 pupils are meeting national curriculum requirements.
